England in the War of the Spanish Succession: A Study of ... - Anderson Shelter. Named after Sir John Anderson, the Lord Privy Seal, who was responsible for Air Raid Precautions (ARP). Constructed from corrugated iron, about 2 metres long, with semi-circular roof and vertical ends, they were sunk about 1 metre into the ground, and projected about 1.1/2 metres above it.
